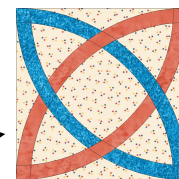
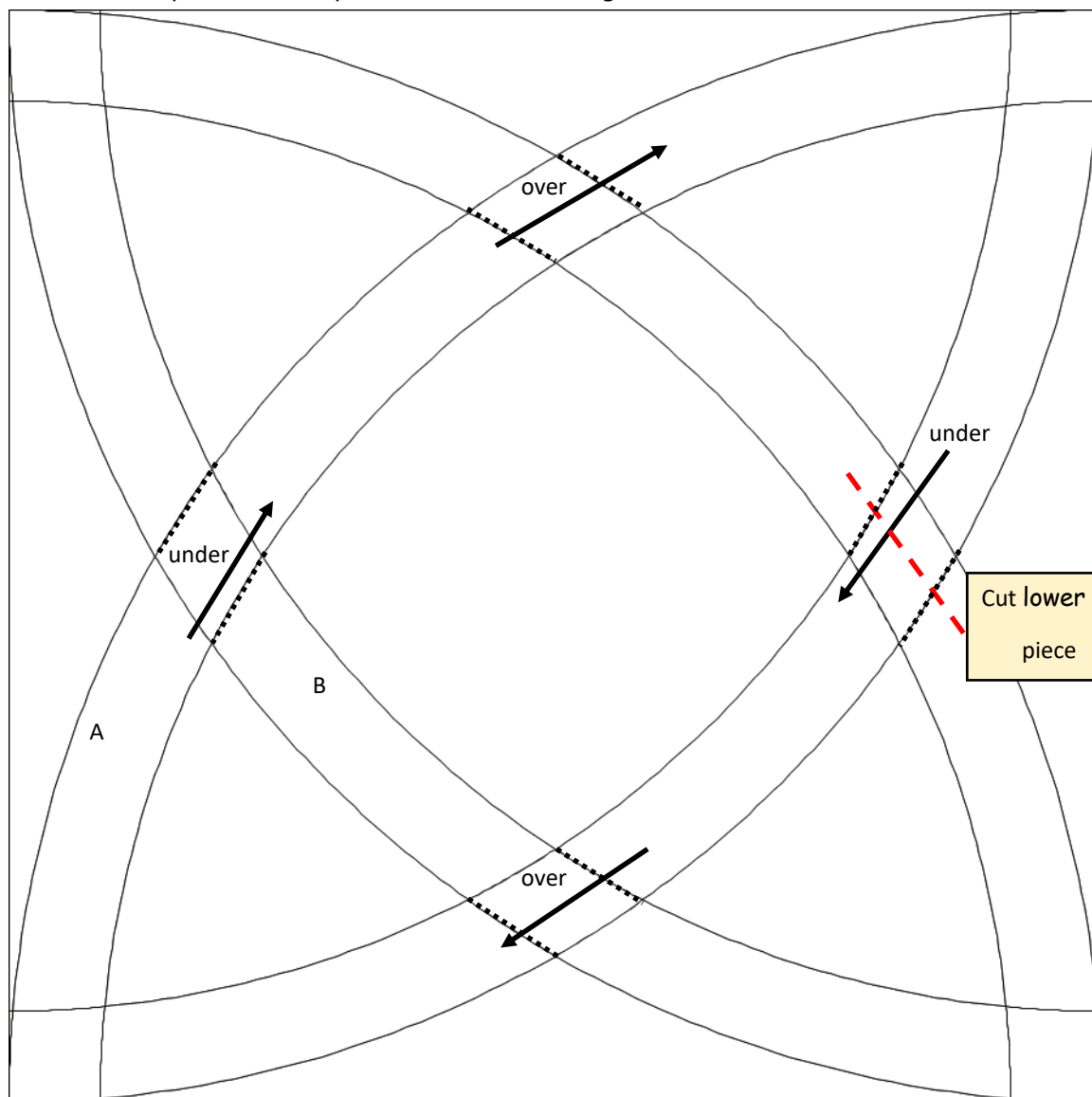


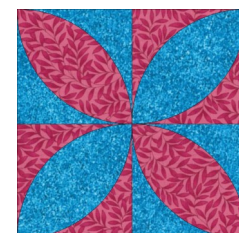
Template Sheet for 6" Pointed Oval finished block.



1. Cut a base fabric of $6\frac{1}{2}$ "
2. Trace the Pointed Oval (orange/aqua sections) as a solid shape to create your pattern for applique. If you prefer to use a different colour on the points, allow seam allowance on the underneath pieces.
3. Draw the whole melon shape onto Vlisofix (paper side) - you need 2 per block as shown below.
4. Separate the tracings and iron to the wrong side of your Pointed Oval fabric – 2 different colours or the same – this depends on how you wish to create using them.

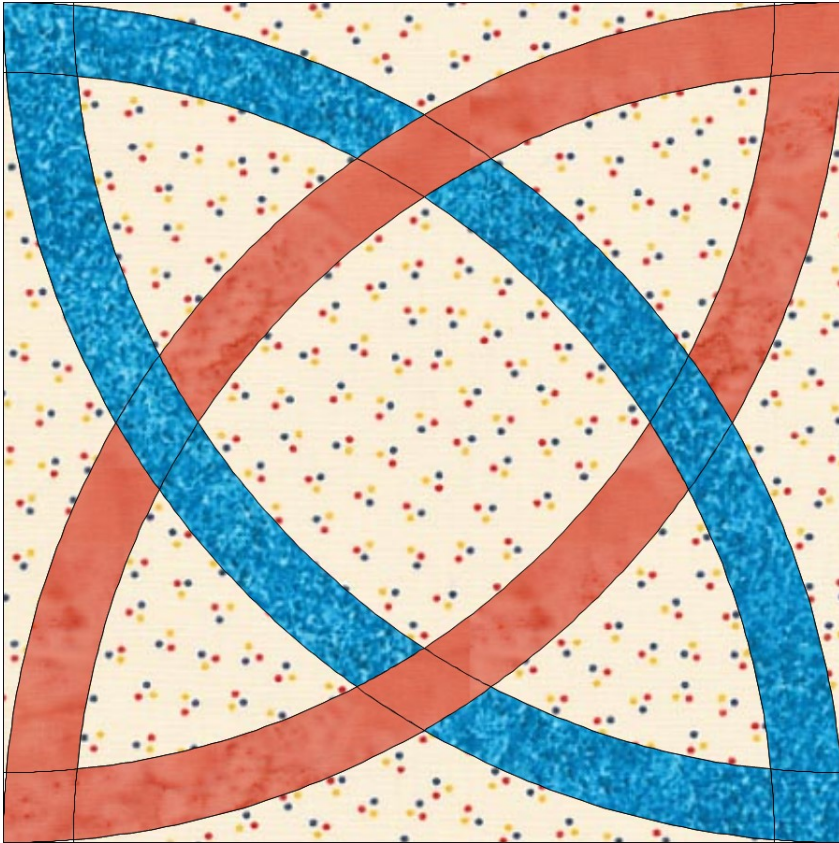


5. Cut carefully on the lines and you will be able to use the inside melon shape to create parts of another block like the orange peel block shown here.
6. Cut Fabric position marked - - - on fabric A and this will allow you to weave the 2 fabrics as shown with under and over arrows.
7. Shows the fabric underneath at the intersections.
8. Press Pointed Oval shapes to background square (crease on diagonals to help place the ovals) & applique, by machine or hand.



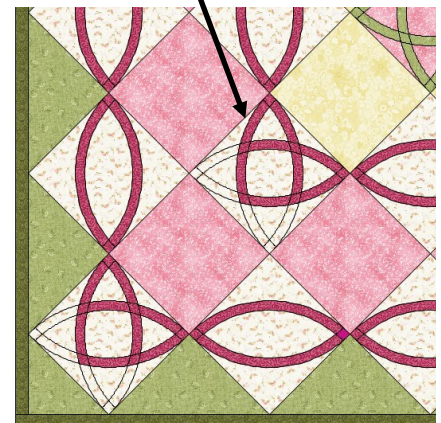
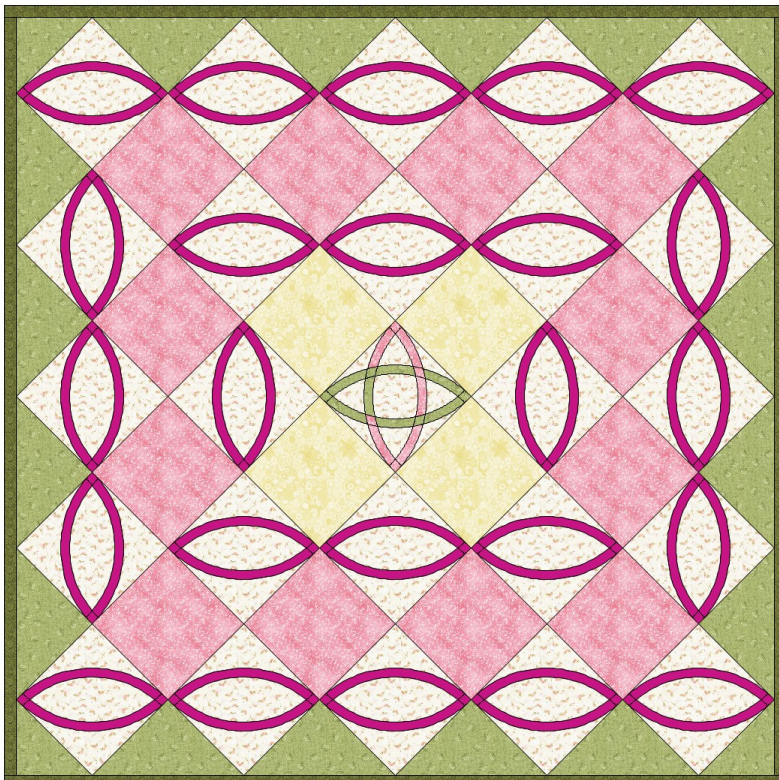

6" Pointed Oval finished block Ideas.

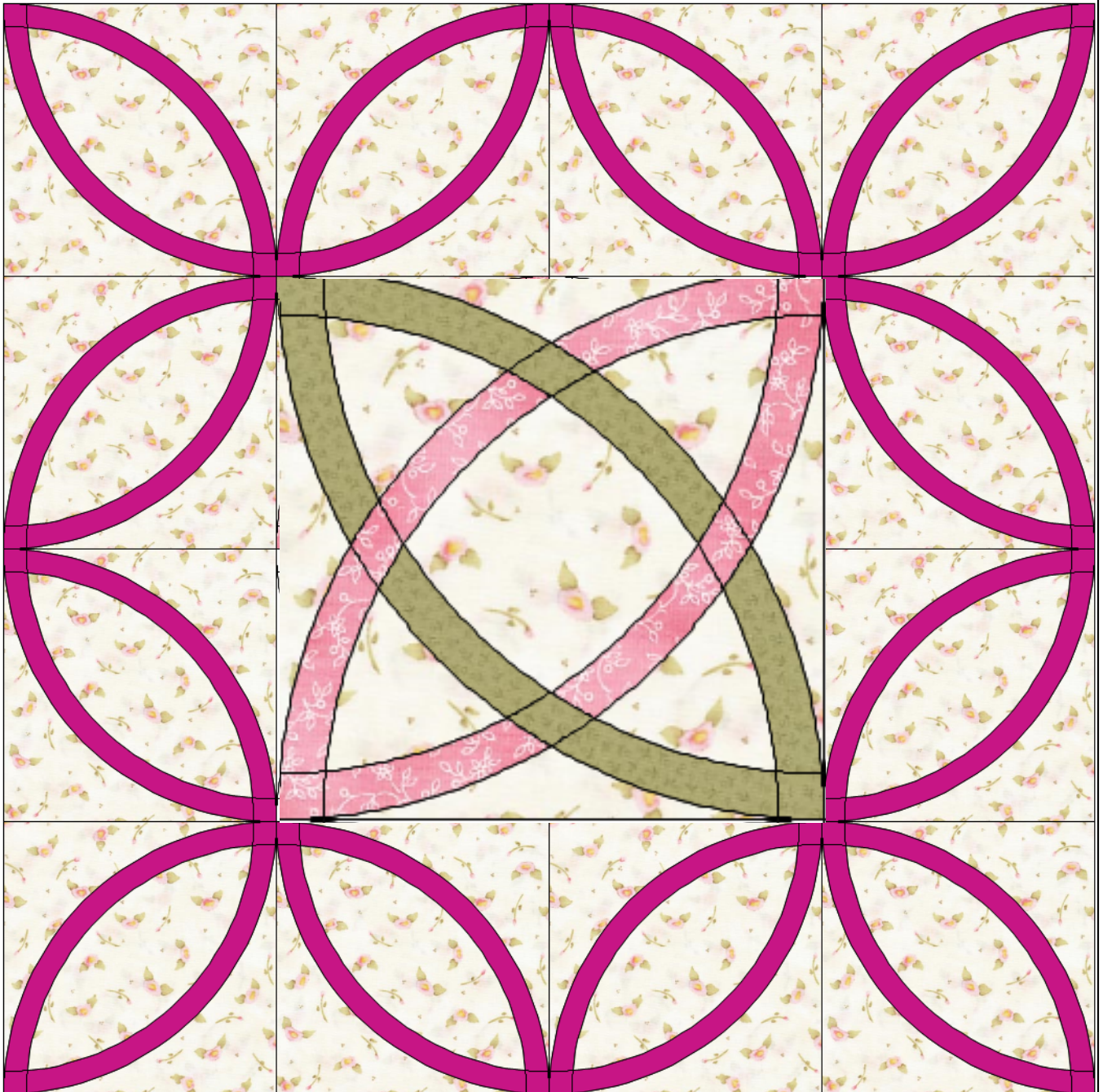


Ideas:

1. Use multiple 6" blocks to create an interweaving pattern.
2. Enlarge or reduce the pattern block to create other designs.
3. Use only 1 Pointed oval to create the blocks shown below.
4. Set blocks on Point to linked patterns or to use in borders.
5. Create a corner design as shown in the enlarge image below



Mixed sizes - Pointed Oval quilt.



1. Enlarge the pattern to 12" for a centre section then add 6" blocks for surrounding border.
2. Use 6" block for the centre and reduce block to 3" for the border.
