

Pointed Oval Dragonfly © Jan Phillips 2023

This design has been created using the Pointed Oval pattern from my Cupboard to Creativity Challenge Feb 2023.

<u>You will need:</u>

- 1. Copies of the pointed oval pattern shape (6" finished block on page 2) traced onto Vlisofix, then ironed onto the wrong side of your outline fabric: Print reduce to
 - $4\frac{1}{2}$ " (need 4 for wings), 3"(1 for body) and 1 of $2\frac{1}{2}$ ", 2 of 2" & 1 of $1\frac{1}{2}$ for the tail
- 2. An enlarged copy of the dragonfly pattern—print page given by 200%
- 3. A square of background fabric (cut 16")
- 4. A square of the dragonfly colour Cut 16")
- 5. Greaseproof paper to trace onto it the enlarged dragonfly shape (change the position of the top wings if you want a more open dragonfly—this may affect the fabric size required).

Method as shown in the video.

- a. Place background fabric right side up on table
- b. Place the dragonfly fabric right side up over top of background fabric
- c. Pin the enlarged traced copy of the dragonfly into a position on your fabric.
- d. Sew a small zigzag just inside the oval shapes (refer to video)
- e. Tear away paper & trim top fabric away to reveal the dragonfly.
- f. Cut out the pointed oval outline shapes and peel off paper then position over the zig zag stitching press in place. Follow the video for tips on placement.
- g. Zigzag or use another stitch to applique outline into place. I would recommend placing a sheet of the greaseproof or some stabilizer behind the block for this step to minimise stretching.
- h. When sewing is completed, trim background to $15\frac{1}{2}$ " square and use in centre of a quilt, on a bag, as a cushion...... Wherever you want to:)
